# 27th Annual Strawberry Fest a Huge Success

The 27th Annual Strawberry Fest and Whatzit Appraisal Fair were held on Sunday, June 26. The weather was good and the strawberry shortcake was great according to those in attendance. A large turnout of history buffs and strawberry shortcake lovers was hand. The Strawberry Fest and Whatzit Appraisal Fair is our major fund raiser for the year. Besides strawberry shortcake, hot dogs and barbeques, soda, and bottled water were served. We apologize for running out of strawberry shortcake and barbeques, but that occurred because of the large crowd on hand.

This is the third year that we have had

demonstrations of "Lost Art" which included timber framing, rosemaling, rug weaving with a loom, hand sewn quilting and making yarn with a spinning wheel.

Those in attendance had an opportunity to visit our historic village which includes the original Iola & Northern Railway depot built in 1894 and houses our railroad and transportation memorabilia, the Helvetia Town Hall which currently houses two special displays of 100 years of the Iola Winter Sports Club and ski jumping in Iola and the 150th anniversary of the Iola Grist Mill.

Another building is a replica of the first Iola fire house that was built in 1900

and houses a trio of original fire fighting equipment owned by the Iola Fire Department including the first mechanized equipment, a horse drawn 1912 Waterous Pumper, 1924 Ford Model 'T' hose truck and 1939 REO Speed Wagon fire truck built by R. I. Anderson at his machine shop here in Iola. Mr. Anderson continued building fire trucks for several more years and ended up building 24 fire trucks over the years. The Iola Historical Society possesses photographs of four additional trucks that he built.

include a log cabin and a replica of an old country school house. The latest building acquired and located across the street from the village currently houses a display honoring Lee Nelson who served in WWII as a B17 pilot. Lee flew 31 bombing missions over Germany and France from May through July of 1944, during which time he earned four Air Medals and the Distinguished Flying Cross. It also includes a model of a B17 that Lee carved in 1945 while he was still in the military and stationed in Texas as a flight instructor. Other exhibits currently housed in this building include 100 Years of Boy Scouting in the United States, Norwegian trunks and many other items

#### **New Fund Raiser**

On Saturday, October 2, the Iola Historical Society will host a new fund raiser that will be held annually. The event will be the Lost Art Fair and Taste of Norway. It will be held on the same weekend as the Hidden Studios'art tours. Also taking place at the historical society on the same day will be the I-S Craft and Gift Show and the Northland Church will host special cooking lessons on how to make rosettes, sandbukkels, krumkake, fattigman, lefse and other pastries.
