



## Iola's First "Veterans Day" Honored 54 "Boys" Serving In "The Great War"

As reported in the August 22, 1918, edition of the *Iola Herald*, a special service flag dedication on Iola's Main Street, conducted on Friday evening, August 16, had recognized 54 "soldiers and sailors from Iola village who have gone to serve their county in the great war for democracy." Intended to impart a "lesson of patriotism deeply impressed on the minds of all who were present" and might subsequently view it, the large flag boldly displayed 54 stars, one each honoring the 54 soldiers and sailors who

had enlisted or been drafted.

The report indicated that several hundred were in attendance at the evening event, "the clouds (having) cleared away about supper time," hosted at 7:30 in an area of the street roped off in front of the I.O.O.F. Hall. The flag was suspended from a cable stretched across the street from Hall's balcony to a utility pole that stood two doors south of the brick structure housing the Bank of Iola and a drug store (presently Jake's Barber Shop and Traci's Main Street Salon).

The evening commenced with a half hour concert performed by the Iola and Waupaca bands, following which the banner, with a white field bordered in red, was unfurled. Displayed in the field of white were 54 stars, 52 of them blue and the

other two gold, the latter paying tribute to Isaac Huun and Lester Peterson, who had died in camp. Following an invocation pronounced by Rev. Anthony Jacobs of Waupaca, with the attendees sanding the bands played *The Star Spangled Banner*, as scouts Corin Peterson and Douglas Paulson unfurled the banner.

"The dedicatory address by Rev. Jacobs," the *Iola Herald* reported, "was a brief but stirring message of praise for the boys over there and of admonition to those at home to live up to the things for which the service flag stands: loyalty to our country; faithful service to our boys and their allies over there; sacrifices that democracy may win in the struggle

against autocterty (sic) and a victory be won that shall make war in the future impossible; refusal to profit financially from the needs of the allies and Uncle Sam; devotion of our time and our wealth to the service of our country."

Noting that the Rev. Jacobs' received "close attention and received great applause at the close," the report in the *Herald* concluded; "After special music by a mixed choir and a selection by the two bands, the service was over. It was certainly a memorable occasion and should leave a lesson of patriotism deeply impressed on the minds of all who were present."
