PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

This time out, I thought I'd share a few words on the Iola Historical Society's "organic" attributes, a theme most of us are seldom likely to think of even in passing. We/ve experienced phenomenal organic growth – i.e., the systematic coordinated growth of our parts and people . . . through more than 70 years of dedicated service to the preservation of local history and heritage.

Building on a tradition established at the time of its organization on October 28, 1953, when about a dozen local ladies assembled to pursue the recording of the development of Iola from the already thinning contingent of those who had lived the experience, we have slowly but steadily organically advanced to become a primary museum and repository of the artifacts and styles of those times.

By the time the Society introduced a newsletter nearly 50 years later – see glimpses of how we were progressing in the Spring issues of 2001 and 2004, reproduced on pages 7 and 8 – our objective was proclaimed as; Remembering the Past, Living the Present, Planning the Future. At the time, we were four structures – Depot, Log Cabin, One-Room Schoolhouse, and Helvetia Town Hall – having since organically grown to eight; 1901 Firehouse, Machine Shed exhibition building, Museum and the archival storage buildings.

Our membership has grown organically as well. None of our current directors and officers were active back then. Presidents Robert Crase and Murnell Olson, along with Vice-Presidents Lila Aanstad and Stella Strand, at the time were among the long-time and steadfast members. We have advanced on the shoulders of new contributors and their dedication . . . we will organically continue to develop and grow into the future on the shoulders of their . . . and your dedication.

MARCH 29th, 2004 MEETING

From the President:

One of the signs of spring is the resumption of monthly meetings and other activities of the Iola Historical Society; Monday, MARCH 29 is the day and 7:30PM is the time. The meeting will be held in the Country School. If there is too much water at the entrance to the grounds, we will need to find another place to meet such as the Village Hall.

Membership dues are collected at the March meeting which assures you of getting three newsletters created annually. Your membership can be mailed. Your dues will be accepted at subsequent meetings as well.

150 YEARS

It has been 150 years since the Iola and Scandinavia area was populated by immigrants from Europe. Although the Swiss were the first settlers, the Norwegians soon dominated the population for several reasons. The topography of the land reminded them of Norway and the land was \$1.25 an acre. Having a common language, Norwegian, was certainly helpful in settling the family near other Norwegians

forming a community. Neighbors who understood each other must have been very important since they must have needed to borrow a cup of sugar or a hammer once in a while. Sponsorship was necessary in later years in order to enter the US which brought brothers and sisters to join the families that were already here. This assured a place to live and work until they could make a "living" for themselves. The Church was very important for the immigrants. After six to eight weeks in a wooden vessel out at sea and surviving, they had reason to pay tribute to God by worshiping and eventually they built churches.

This story is not unique to the Norwegians. Groups of immigrants from all over the world formed their own communities in the "New Land", "America"

There will be many events around Wisconsin that will be celebrating their sesquicentennial as our state celebrated back in 1998.

News from our Neighboring **Historical Societies:**

Waupaca Historical Society has good news. They have officially purchased the Railroad Depot in Waupaca for \$10,000.00 It will not be moved. A chain-link fence

will separate the Depot from the rail tracks which are still used. They have a large task in restoring the building. Anyone who wishes get involved by donating money or labor is most welcome. Congratulations Waupaca HS! They have several activities planned for this year. Their news letter will be available for more details at the March meeting.

The Hutchinson House in South Park in Waupaca is 150 years old this year.

We are invited to visit the Marion Historical Society and their recently acquired caboose, similar to ours, that was restored by the previous private owner. We will visit Marion in August. Green Bay celebrates their Sesquicentennial in 2004 with multiple events.

The Republican political party is 150 years old this year. The first meeting, official or unofficial, was held in Ripon, Wisconsin. They will also have some special events to celebrate this milestone.

Gone, But Fondly Recalled

Lest we forget, recalled below are valued friends and members who passed recently. Please remember them with appreciation, as you reflect on their valued contributions to preserving the heritage of our community and area.

Roger E. Olson

This lifelong Iola resident was born on July 30, 1939, passing away at Weston under hospice care on March 22, 2025. An Honorary Life Member of the Iola Historical Society, his services to the organization ranged from moving the pioneer style log cabin from the Wrolstad farm in the town of Harrison to our Historic Village campus, along with setting the vintage caboose alongside the historic 1894 Iola & Northern Depot, to tending to our exhibit area electrical installation needs. A community volunteer for all seasons, he was to the end also engaged with the needs of the Iola Winter Sports Club, the Iola Old Car Show, the Glacier Wood Golf Club, Our Savior's Lutheran Church and many others. Seasonally he'd be encountered mowing lawns, plowing snow and trimming trees. His working career was spent as a lineman, retiring from the Central Wisconsin Electric Cooperative after 40-plus years of service. In the 1980s he proudly sponsored and coached Roger's Tree Trimmers, a ladie's league team that played in the Taylor Field softball league.

Leslie "Les" Solberg

Passing away on March 4, 2025, Les Solberg was born on August 18,1951. Claiming Iola as his "homeland," Les was possibly born in Waupaca. He cherished fishing, grilling brats, cold beers, Packers football and local history. Les will be dearly missed, but never forgotten by the legion of family and friends he left behind, who always enjoyed his always uncanny just right stories, with just the right amount of embellishment, depending on the audience.
